



A Comprehensive Online Course for Research and Development Professionals in the Water Sector

Gender Mainstreaming in Water Research

COURSE OBJECTIVES

This short course aims to train research and development professionals in the water sector to design, carry out and report on water research in which gender considerations have been mainstreamed. This entails developing gender disaggregated data explored through questions that include women's concerns, gender disparities and aid in women-centered interventions to close gender gaps. Each participant is expected to acquire skills that include all the following steps in carrying out a good research study that leads to action on the ground:

- Developing research grid and indicators
- Quantitative Research methodology
- Qualitative Research methodology
- Development of research tools and guidelines
- Sampling, fieldwork and data collection
- Data compilation, processing and tabulation
- Data analysis and reporting

Participants will learn to use gender and participatory frameworks to inform the design and delivery of their research studies, such as:

- Women in Development/ Women and Development/Gender and Development
- Harvard Analytical Framework
- Participatory Rural Appraisal Framework
- Gender Web

COURSE PARTICIPANTS

This course is designed for post-graduate students, government staff, professionals, researchers, writers, and people working in industry, agriculture, private organizations, and NGOs that are already involved in research or would like to be involved in research relating to gender mainstreaming in water. Since this is a very hands-on course and participants will be required to carry out each successive step to completion, it is advisable for an organization to send at least two people so they can work on the research studies as a team. It is preferable to have gender balance in nominating participants from your respective organization.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The course will be divided into three parts.

- Part 1: Research designing 4 days of classroom instruction August 23-26, 2021
- Part 2: Data collection- 10 days to get data from the field August 27- 5 September, 2021
- Part 3: Compilation and reporting- 3 days of classroom instruction September 6-8, 2021

35 hours of online lectures in Part 1 and 3 of the short course (three sessions each day). Classes for Part 1 and Part 3 will be held in three time slots of 9:30-11:00 am, 11:30 am-1:00 pm and 3:00-5:00 pm on August 23-26 and September 6-8. Part 1 is 20 hours of teaching, Part 2 will not have any teaching hours and participants will be expected to be out in the field collecting data, and Part 3 will be 15 hours of teaching, followed by small group discussions and written assignments.

Participants will be required to work daily on their own unique research study. The idea is that they learn from their classroom teaching and immediately apply that learning to their own research studies.

Participants will be expected to work in small groups where two to four participants can work on the same study. They will be provided reading materials that they will have to keep up with during the workshop and we expect them to be doing these readings.

Trainers will be available for any questions on Friday, August 27 and Monday, August 30 between 10:00 am-12:00 pm for any questions participants may have.

Ms. Simi Kamal is Advisor to the Panjwani-Hisaar Water Institute (PHWI) and its Executive Board Member. She is the Chairperson and CEO of Hisaar Foundation, and the founder of several other forprofit and non-profit organizations and networks, including the Universities for Network, and the Women and Water Network. She is on the Board of the International Water Management Institute (Sri Lanka) and served on Technical Advisory Committee on the Global Water Partnership (Sweden) for 9 years. She was the Chief of Party of Gender Equity Program for six years and until recently was the head of Programs at Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF). She has been to 50 countries, is known globally for both her work in water sector and for women's rights and has led and been part of over 200 research studies. Mr. Mansoor Raza has 30 years of experience in quantitative and qualitative research and development, trainings, story writing and translation (English to Urdu).
