One of the major achievements of the NEED or 'Network of Excellence in Energy Development' Society this year has been the successful undertaking of an International Conference on Energy and Sustainability (CES) that was held on the 27th of April 2013 in the Mechanical Engineering Department of NED-UET. The objective was to provide a for um for exchange of ideas and information regarding current research activities in sustainable energy and discussion of plans for addressing the relevant issues in the country. The participants included notable scientists, engineers, managers, and policy makers from various countries including the UK and Saudi Arabia. The papers presented at the conference had been peer-reviewed by experts in the respective fields and were related to power generation, renewable and alternative energy, and hybrid energy solutions, to name a few.

Established in NED University of Engineering and Technology, The NEED Society, as the acronym suggests, is a collaboration of professionals that aims to tackle one of the most crucial, necessary issues of our time, and particularly of the region in recent years; the energy crisis. This research group focuses on small and large-scale projects that explore new and alternative methods of energy production.

On 17 January, the Debating Society, under the guidance of Ms.Nausheen Kidwai, successfully organized a Qirat, Naat and Seerat-un-Nabi (S.A.W.) competition, in the auditorium of NEDUET.
